Theodore P. Baerg, B Mus Hon, CAEA, ACTRA, AGMA, NATS

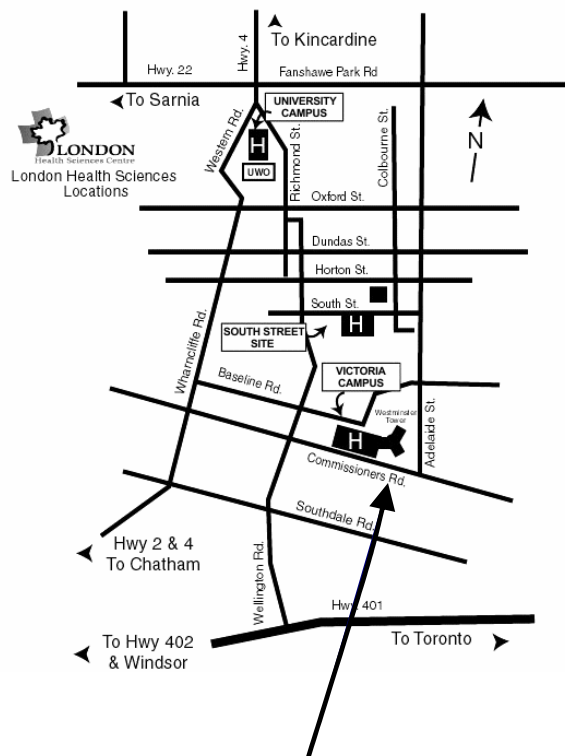

Vocal Health Clinic

Patients with voice concerns who have occupational and professional voice demands will benefit from our comprehensive, multidisciplinary, and multidimensional approach using state-of-the-art voice testing

Our professional team of voice experts from the University of Western Ontario includes an otolaryngologist, speech pathologist, and vocal artist.

Emphasis at the Vocal Health Clinic is placed on education about healthy vocal habits, prevention of voice problems, and diagnosis.

Multidisciplinary voice clinic for occupational and professional voice users

Once a referral to our clinic has been made, either by you or your community physician, we will mail you a new-patient package which will include a general medical form and a voice questionnaire, as well as a stamped self-addressed envelope for you to send back to us.

We will then contact you to arrange an appointment. This appointment will last about 2 hours and will include:

- Hearing test (audiogram)
- Pulmonary function test
- Acoustic analysis
- Aerodynamic testing
- Perceptual assessment and judgment of quality
- Digital Videostroboscopic examination to assess vocal cord movement
- Endoscopic laryngoscopy
- Speech pathology assessment
- Vocal arts assessment
- Otolaryngology (Ear, nose, throat) assessment

A sound diagnosis and plan

At the conclusion of your visit with us, our team will formulate an individualized diagnosis and care plan. We will give you a written report, and copies of your test results including a DVD and photograph of your larynx (voice box).

Depending on your diagnosis, treatment recommendations *may* include one or more of the following:

- Voice therapy
- Vocal arts / speech training
- Medications
- Laryngeal laser microsurgery
- Massage therapy
- Physical therapy
